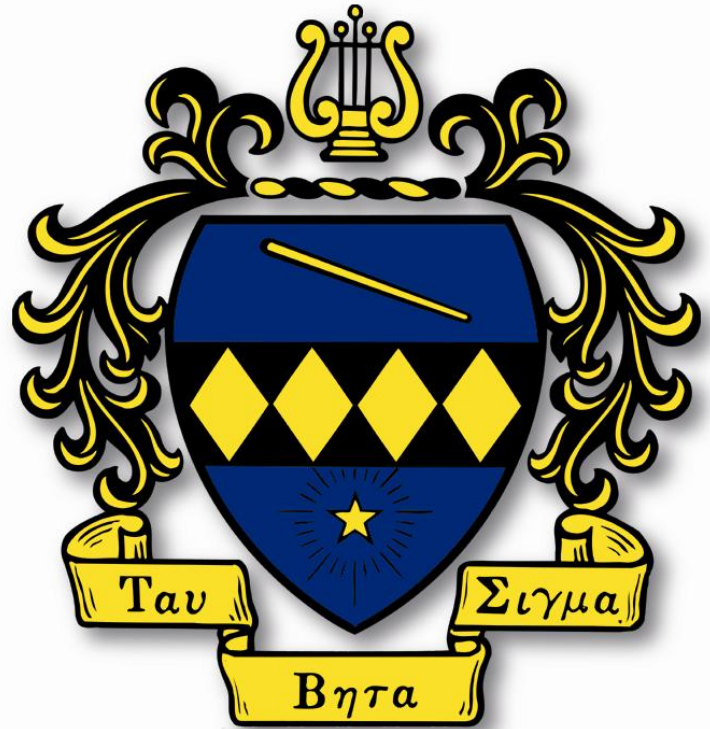

Kappa Kappa Psi & Tau Beta Sigma

Western District Joint Constitution

Revised: March 27th, 2011

Article I Purpose

1.1 Be it known that the Western District of Kappa Kappa Psi, National Honorary Band Fraternity, and Tau Beta Sigma, National Honorary Band Sorority, are herewith established with the intent of promoting the cause of band music; furthermore, the Chapters of the Joint Western District shall combine their resources toward that end, yet remain distinct in identity and ritual.

1.2 The Western District Challenge is as follows:

The Western District commits itself to the highest standard of individual, Chapter and District responsibility. In an effort to achieve this goal, each member and chapter will turn in every form, receipt, fee, and application, complete and on time, every time. The Western District challenges all Districts to exceed our high commitment to excellence. Doing the most is the least you can do.

1.3 The Western District Joint Mission Statement is as follows:

"United by music, the Western District Joint Organizations of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma are committed to enthusiastic service to college and university band programs, by establishing the standards of excellence for the leadership, expansion, loyalty, and cooperation."

Article II General

2.1 The Constitution of the Joint Western District is to be used in conjunction with the National Constitutions of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma and the separate Western District Constitutions of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.

2.2 This document shall not take precedence over the National Constitution of Kappa Kappa Psi or the National Constitution of Tau Beta Sigma.

2.3 A district year is defined as the time between the adjournment of Western District Conventions.

Article III Officers

3.1 The Joint Western District Council shall consist of Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Officers, Tau Beta Sigma Western District Officers, Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Governor(s), and Tau Beta Sigma Western District Counselor(s).

3.2 Kappa Kappa Psi Western District President / Tau Beta Sigma Western District President shall:

3.2.1 Preside over all joint meetings of the Western District. The presidents shall be members ex-officio of all Joint Western District Committees.

3.3 Kappa Kappa Psi Vice President / Tau Beta Sigma Vice President of Membership shall:

- 3.3.1 Preside at joint meetings of the Western District in the absence of their respective Western District President.
- 3.3.2 Be responsible for the general membership.
- 3.3.3 Be responsible for the content of the Western District website.
- 3.4 Kappa Kappa Psi Member-at-Large / Tau Beta Sigma Vice President of Special Projects shall:
 - 3.4.1 Be responsible for projects deemed necessary by the Western District Council.
 - 3.4.2 Be responsible for organizing and maintaining the history of the Western District.
- 3.5 Kappa Kappa Psi Secretary-Treasurer / Tau Beta Sigma Secretary-Treasurer shall:
 - 3.5.1 Be responsible for recording, publishing, and distributing the minutes from all joint meetings of the Western District.
 - 3.5.2 Be responsible for coordinating the execution of *The Accent* with the Publishers.
 - 3.5.3 Be responsible for organizing and maintaining all Joint Western District fundraisers.
 - 3.5.4 Be responsible for facilitating fundraising between Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma Chapter Treasurers specifically for the Western District Emergency Fund should the emergency monies fall below a minimum balance.
 - 3.5.5 The outgoing Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma Secretary-Treasurers shall author and compile minutes from convention and the incoming Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma Secretary-Treasurers shall publish and distribute said minutes from convention.
- 3.6 Kappa Kappa Psi Parliamentarian / Tau Beta Sigma Parliamentarian shall:
 - 3.6.1 Advise the Joint Western District Council and membership at-large regarding points of parliamentary procedure.
 - 3.6.2 Provide a copy of the Joint Western District Constitution to the members of the Joint Jurisdiction Committee.
- 3.7 Joint Western District Webmaster shall:
 - 3.7.1 Be responsible for the Western District website as specified in Article 7.2.
 - 3.7.2 Provide access to *The Accent* on the website.
 - 3.7.3 Maintain an online submission form for *The Accent* on the Western District website, which shall automatically be directed to *The Accent* publishers.

**Article IV
Meetings**

- 4.1 A regularly called convention of the Western District shall be held in the Spring of each year.
 - 4.1.1 Bids for the Western District Convention shall conform to the following requirements:
 - 4.1.1.1 The chapter(s) must be active and in good standing with the National Headquarters

of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.

- 4.1.1.2 The chapter(s) must be financially able to host the Western District Convention, and must be able to provide proof of financial stability for the last two (2) years.
- 4.1.1.3 The Sponsor(s) must submit an evaluation of the chapter(s).
- 4.1.1.4 The bid must comply with convention site policy as determined by the National Councils of Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.
- 4.1.1.5 The bid must be flexible enough to include a minimum of one (1) of the following dates:
 - Last weekend in March
 - First weekend in April
 - Second weekend in April
- 4.1.1.6 All bids to host Western District Convention shall be submitted to the Western District Governor(s) and Counselor(s) a minimum of two (2) weeks before the upcoming Western District Convention.
- 4.1.1.7 The chapter(s) must address all items from the "Bid Selection Checklist for Western District Convention" in their bid packet.
- 4.1.2 In the event that no bids are submitted within the required timeline, as previously specified, or that the Joint Western District does not decide on a site and host(s) for the next Western District Convention, the convention site and host(s) shall be decided by the Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Governor(s) and the Tau Beta Sigma Western District Counselor(s).
- 4.1.3 Chapters may seat proxy delegates in committees at the discretion of the chapter and Governor(s) or District Counselor based on the chapter proxy form.
- 4.2 The Joint Western District Council shall meet a minimum of three (3) times per year for the expressed purpose of discussing District matters.
 - 4.2.1 A passing vote in Joint District matters shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority approval within both separate councils.
 - 4.2.2 The Joint Western District Council shall determine the Chapter of the Year Award recipient.
- 4.3 Each state containing chapters shall be responsible for holding a pre-convention meeting called State(s) Days.
 - 4.3.1 State(s) Days must occur before the second weekend in March or a minimum of three (3) weeks prior to the Western District Convention, whichever is earlier in the year.
 - 4.3.1.1 Host chapters must send an inquiry to all chapters within their rotation with at least three (3) proposed dates.
 - 4.3.1.2 Host chapters must submit a proposed date to the Western District Presidents no later than December 1 for approval.
 - 4.3.2 State(s) Days host(s) shall follow a rotation unique to each state. Once a school hosts State(s) Days, they move to the bottom of the rotation.

- 4.3.2.1 Should a school be unable or unwilling to host their State(s) Days, the school must notify the District Officers, Governors, and Counselor, in writing by October 15.
- 4.3.2.2 The next school in the list shall be notified by the Joint Western District Council of their hosting duty.
- 4.3.2.3 Upon relinquishing their duties as State(s) Days host(s), said school shall be skipped in the rotation.

- 4.3.2.6 Utah State Day Rotation:
Utah State University
University of Utah

- 4.3.2.7 Wagon States Day Rotation:
University of Washington

University of Oregon
- 4.3.3 State Days hosts shall organize and implement a profit-share fundraiser in which fifty (50) percent of the proceeds go to the District and fifty (50) percent may be kept by the State Days host(s).

**Article V
Committees**

- 5.1 The Western District shall have the following joint standing committees: Programs, Jurisdiction, Publications, and Convention Site.
- 5.2 The Programs Committee shall:
 - 5.2.1 Examine new ideas for improving music awareness and service through Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.
 - 5.2.2 Evaluate the candidates, and select recipients for each of the following awards, as laid out in Article VIII:
 - For Music's Sake
 - For Service's Sake
 - For Community's Sake

Delegate Distance Award
Chapter Participation Award

- 5.3 The Jurisdiction Committee shall:
- 5.3.1 Examine all proposed changes to the Joint Western District Constitution.
- 5.4 The Publications Committee shall:
- 5.4.1 Evaluate the effectiveness of the current format of The Accent
 - 5.4.2 Evaluate the effectiveness of the website and the Listserv.
 - 5.4.3 Include The Accent Publishers and the Webmaster on the committee.
- 5.5 The Convention Site Committee shall:
- 5.5.1 Evaluate the eligibility, in accordance with 4.1, of all bids to host the next Western District Convention and slate one (1) bid to be presented to the Joint Western District.
 - 5.5.2 Have the authority to waive any bid requirement, except 4.1.1.1 and 4.1.1.4.
 - 5.5.3 Review and revise the *How to Bid for Convention* document, which may include requirements, recommendations, and suggestions directed towards prospective bidding chapter(s).

Article VI
Finances

- 6.1 The Western District Emergency Fund shall be maintained by the District for the purpose of providing emergency monies for the District, and shall operate as follows:
- 6.1.1 An application must be submitted by chapters to be voted on by the Joint District Council.
 - 6.1.2 Each separate council will provide fifty (50) percent of the agreed upon amount. Monies provided in this fashion to an active chapter shall be considered a donation.

Article VII
Publications

- 7.1 The Western District Publication shall be *The Accent*.
- 7.1.1 The Joint Western District Accent Publishers shall be active members in good standing and shall serve for a term of one (1) year, with no limit to the number of terms that may be served.
 - 7.1.2 The Joint Western District Council shall review all applications received for Publishers by thirty (30) days after the conclusion of Convention and shall appoint a Publisher from each organization to the position within two (2) weeks.
 - 7.1.3 The Joint Western District Council shall appoint new Publishers from each organization within thirty (30) days of any vacancy.
 - 7.1.4 In the event that there are no applications for Publishers the publication shall fall under the discretion of the Joint Western District Council.
 - 7.1.5 Submissions that will be considered for the "Best Of" Edition of the Accent are due no later than:

Fall November 1
Winter March 1
Spring Two (2) weeks after the Western District Convention

7.1.6 The Accent "Best Of" Edition must be published at least three (3) times per year

Fall November 15
Winter March 15
Spring Four (4) weeks after the Western District Convention

7.1.7 The Publishers shall distribute a minimum of one (1) copy of the Accent "Best Of" Edition per District Officer, Governor or Counselor, Chapter, and Colony of both organizations in the Western District as well as National Officers. In addition, the Publishers must provide an electronic copy to the Western District Webmaster.

7.1.8 In the event that the Publishers become unable to fulfill the publication requirements, the Joint Western District Council may vote to revoke the privilege of publishing The Accent "Best of" Edition from said Publishers.

7.1.8.1 In the event that the publication rights have been revoked, publishing duties shall fall under the discretion of the Joint Western District Council.

7.2 The Western District shall maintain a website.

7.2.1 The Western District Webmaster shall serve for a term of one (1) year, with no limit to the number of terms that may be served.

7.2.2 The Joint Western District Council shall review all applications received for Webmaster by May 1 and shall appoint the position within two (2) weeks.

7.2.3 The Joint Western District Council shall appoint a new Webmaster within two (2) weeks of any vacancy.

7.2.4 The Western District Webmaster shall be responsible for updating the website within one (1) week of major events or requests. If the requests cannot be completed within one (1) week, the Webmaster shall notify the requester of the expected time of completion.

Article VIII Awards

8.1 The Chapter of the Year Award shall be presented in recognition of an outstanding chapter. The qualifications for this award shall be: District and National participation, Brotherly and Sisterly bonds, adherence to the Western District Challenge, chapter growth and retention, and exemplary service to its college band programs. The winner shall be decided by the Joint Western District Council

8.2 The For Music's Sake Award shall be presented in recognition of the project that best promotes community service related to music.

8.3 The For Service's Sake Award shall be presented in recognition of the project that best promotes service to college bands.

8.4 The For Community's Sake Award shall be presented in recognition of the project that best promotes community service. The project may involve music, but must be held for a purpose not specifically related to music.

- 8.5 The Delegate Distance Award shall be presented in recognition of the delegate(s) who travel the furthest distance to Convention.
- 8.6 The Chapter Participation Award shall be presented in recognition of the chapter that traveled the furthest distance to Convention, with the greatest percentage of total active membership, according to the following formula:

$$\frac{(\text{Number of chapter's Actives at Convention}) \times (\text{Distance from the chapter's location to Convention location})}{\text{Number of total Actives in the chapter}}$$

**Article IX
Amendments**

- 9.1 Any part of this Constitution may be amended at any time by a simple majority of all eligible voting chapters of each organization.

Discussion:

The 2011 Joint Jurisdiction Committee met and discussed the charges from the 2010 Joint Jurisdiction Committee, the proposals presented by the Joint Western District Committees, and all other submitted proposals from the active membership. Specifically, we examined the state of the publications committee and *The Accent*, site committee recommendations, and other district matters. Upon revision of these items, the 2011 Joint Jurisdiction Committee produced the recommendations and charges listed below.

Charges:

The 2011 Joint Jurisdiction Committee charges the 2012 Joint Jurisdiction Committee with the following:

1. Examine the definition of the term "year" in the constitution. Discuss whether a year refers to the district year, calendar year, fiscal year, or just 365 days.
2. Establish grammatical changes before starting "new business" within a recommendation. This will make the discussion run smoother by hammering out all wording and language discrepancies before the examination of the motion as a viable amendment.

The 2011 Joint Jurisdiction Committee charges the 2012 Joint Western District Officers with the following:

1. Evaluate the necessity of a framework for DLC in the Joint Western District Constitution and if deemed necessary drafted said framework.

Recommendations:

The 2011 Joint Jurisdiction Committee recommends that:

1. Article 4.3.2.5 be amended to add "Fullerton College" below San Jose State University and remove "Diablo Valley College" from the California State Days Rotation.
2. Article 4.3.2.7 be amended to read: "Wagon States Days Rotation".

3. Article 4.3, 4.3.1, 4.3.2, 4.3.2.1, 4.3.2.3, 4.3.3 be amended to read: "State(s) Days" instead of "State Days"
4. Article 1.2 be amended to read: "The Western District commits itself to the highest standard of individual, Chapter and District responsibility. In an effort to achieve this goal, each member and chapter will turn in every form, receipt, fee, and application, complete and on time, every time. 8. Article 4.2, 4.3.3, and 8.1 to be amended to capitalize "District".
9. Article 8.1 to be amended to capitalize "National".
10. Add new Article 2.3 to read: "A district year is defined as the time between Western District Conventions"
11. Article 7.1 be amended to to read:
 - 7.1 The Western District Publication shall be The Accent.
 - 7.1.1 The Joint Western District Accent Publishers shall serve for a term of one (1) District year, with no limit to the number of terms that may be served.
 - 7.1.2 The Joint Western District Council shall review all applications received for Publishers by thirty (30) days after the conclusion of Convention and shall appoint a Publisher from each organization to the position within two (2) weeks.

 - 7.1.6 The Accent "Best Of Edition" must be published at least three (3) times per year:

Fall	November 15
Winter	March 15
Spring	Four (4) weeks after the Western District Convention
 - 7.1.7 The Publishers shall distribute a minimum of one (1) copy of the Accent "Best Of Edition" per District Officer, Governor or Counselor, Chapter, and Colony of both organizations in the Western District as well as all National Officers. In addition, the Publishers must provide an electronic copy to the Western District Webmaster.
 - 7.1.8 In the event that the Publishers become unable to fulfill the publication requirements, the Joint Western District Council may vote to revoke the privilege of publishing The Accent "Best of Edition" from said Publishers.
 - 7.1.8.1 In the event that the publication rights have been revoked, publishing duties shall fall under the discretion of the Joint Western District Council.
12. Article 5.4 to be amended to read as follows.
 - 5.4 The Publications Committee shall:
 - 5.4.1 Evaluate the effectiveness of the current format of The Accent.
 - 5.4.2 Evaluate the effectiveness of the website and the Listserv.
 - 5.4.3 Include The Accent Publishers and the Webmaster on the committee.
13. Article 3.5.2 be amended to read: "Be responsible for coordinating The Accent with the Publishers."
14. Add new Article 4.1.1.7 to read: "The chapter(s) must address all items from the "Bid Selection Checklist for Western District Convention" in their bid packet."
15. Renumber remaining constitutional amendments accordingly to reflect new additions and subtractions.

- 5.2 The Programs Committee shall:
- 5.2.1 Examine new ideas for improving music awareness and service through Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma.
 - 5.2.2 Evaluate the candidates, and select recipients for each of the following awards, as laid out in Article VIII:

For Music's Sake
For Service's Sake
For Community's Sake
Delegate Distance Award
Chapter Participation Award

AND

- 8.7 The Chapter of the Year Award shall be presented in recognition of an outstanding chapter. The qualifications for this award shall be: district and national participation, Brotherly and Sisterly bonds, adherence to the Western District Challenge, chapter growth and retention, and exemplary service to its college band programs. The winner shall be decided by the Joint Western District Council
- 8.8 The For Music's Sake Award shall be presented in recognition of the project that best promotes community service related to music.
- 8.9 The For Service's Sake Award shall be presented in recognition of the project that best promotes service to college bands.
- 8.10 The For Community's Sake Award shall be presented in recognition of the project that best promotes community service. The project may involve music, but must be held for a purpose not specifically related to music.
- 8.11 The Delegate Distance Award shall be presented in recognition of the delegate(s) who travel the furthest distance to Convention.

- 8.12 The Chapter Participation Award shall be presented in recognition of the chapter that traveled the furthest distance to Convention, with the greatest percentage of total active membership, according to the following formula:

(Number of chapter's Actives at Convention) X (Distance from the chapter's location to Convention location)

Number of total Actives in the chapter

Discussion:

We asked the chapter representatives to read through the packets before WD Convention. We took time to allow representatives to read through the For Community's Sake awards because not everyone read submissions prior to our initial meeting. We charged the committee to read through the remaining submissions overnight and return with their top 3 choices, and pros and cons of each category. We were charged with editing the Western District Challenge to make it sound more professional. We also discussed making it grammatically consistent.

For Music's Sake: The committee discussed how each project tied into the purposes and ideals of each organization. We also considered the number of people participating in each project, the impact of each project, and the level of innovation involved in the project.

For Service's sake: The committee discussed the percentage of the chapter involved and the amount of time invested. We discussed the ways in the band program of each chapter benefitted from the project as well as the uniqueness of each project.

For Community's Sake: The committee discussed the impact that the project had on the community, the motivation driving the project, as well as the incorporation of our love for music.

We discussed ways to distribute the submissions for awards so that the chapters of the district can share and learn from the ideas of their fellow chapters. We also discussed recording feedback for the chapters that submitted for awards.

Charges:

TO THE JOINT PROGRAMS COMMITTEE

Find a way to recognize and acknowledge the scope of Service by Chapters. Consider creating an award to encompass the entirety of projects executed by a Chapter within the past year

1. Maintain neutrality in evaluating and considering all service projects, especially those from your own chapter.

TO THE ΚΚΨ MEMBER-AT-LARGE AND ΤΒΣ VICE PRESIDENT OF SPECIAL PROJECTS

Consider how to make the For Sake Application more effective, and clarify what is expected out of a For Sake application.

TO THE WESTERN DISTRICT:

Ensure that your Chapter has a voice in our discussion.

Be as thorough as possible in completing applications for For Sake Awards.

Submit more applications, even if they may be done by other chapters. The awards exist to recognize all of the service done by each chapter

Recommendations:

Send all of the For Sake applications to various chapters, or upload them to the website.

Ensure that someone records feedback on various Service events during discussion.

Release feedback gained during Joint Programs Committee discussions to Chapters.

Award Recipients:

The Honorable Mention in the For Music’s Sake Award goes to Epsilon Kappa for their Girl Scout work in the LA area, because it encouraged a large number of girls to take an interest in music, and to Gamma for their Continuing Music at A University Level Presentation, because of it’s potential impact on recruitment for university bands.

For Music’s Sake: **Theta Eta and Iota Iota** for their Music Literacy night. The chapter worked with a local elementary school to help students and parents learn how to teach reading and math skills to their children through music. The project involved coordinating with music teachers and collegiate students, and helped roughly 1,000 elementary students and their parents learn about the benefits of music in life.

The Honorable Mentions in the For Service’s Sake Award go to Psi for their Field Painting project, Iota Pi for their Epic Day Of Service, and Gamma for their organizing of the UW upper campus library.

For Service’s Sake: **Mu Phi** for their Symphonic Winds retreat. The chapter organized and executed a three day retreat for their concert band program. The project showed great initiative and involved the chapter greatly in service to the concert band program.

The Honorable Mention for this project goes to the Omega Chapters for their participation in Ben’s Bells, a group that paints chimes and distributes them randomly around Tucson to symbolize random acts of kindness.

For Community’s Sake: **Omega and Omega** for their Holiday Concert for Charity. The group raised over \$450 which was donated to the Crisis Nursery. The project was notable because it used the Chapters’ gift in music to aid a community program in a way that wasn’t related to music.

2011 Joint Publications Committee Report

Committee: Joint Publications Committee

The Joint Publications Committee Shall:

1. Review the 2010 Joint Publications Committee Report
2. Review and Revise the Joint WD Constitution to correlate with the new Blog format of *The Accent*

Joint Publications Committee is Charged to:

1. Submit all proposed changes to the Constitution to the Joint Jurisdiction Committee by the end of the first session.
2. Review the 2010 Publications Committee Report.
3. Consider implementing a default *Accent* publication rotation to take effect if no bids are submitted for *The Accent*. This can be utilized similar to the state-days rotation.
4. Evaluate the role of the committee and submit changes (if any) to the Joint Jurisdiction Committee by the end of the first session. The evaluation should include considering the role of the committee in not only slating the publisher of *The Accent* but to include District-wide communication and the Western District Website.

According to the Joint Western District Bylaws:

- 5.4 The Publications Committee shall:
- 5.4.1 Evaluate the eligibility of all bids to publish *The Accent* in accordance with Article VII.
 - 5.4.2 Have the authority to waive any of these requirements.
 - 5.4.3 Review the requirements, recommendations, and suggestions directed toward prospective bidding chapter(s).

AND

- 7.3 The Western District Publication shall be *The Accent*.
- 7.3.1 Bids for *The Accent* shall state in written form why the chapter(s) wish to publish *The Accent*, as well as the method that shall be used and a proposed sample:
 - 7.3.2 The bidding chapter(s) must be responsible for overseeing the production and publication of *The Accent*.
 - 7.3.3 In the event that there is no bid for *The Accent*, or that no bid meets the requirements, the publication shall fall under the discretion of the Western District Council.
 - 7.3.4 *The Accent* must be published at least three (3) times per year.

Spring	Four (4) weeks after the Western District Convention
Fall	November 15
Winter	March 15
 - 7.3.5 Submissions to the publishing chapter(s) of *The Accent* are due no later than:

Spring	Two (2) weeks after the Western District Convention
Fall	November 1
Winter	March 1
 - 7.3.6 The publishing chapter(s) shall distribute a minimum of one (1) copy per District Officer, Governor or Counselor, Chapter, and Colony of both organizations in the Western District as well as all National Officers. In addition, the publishing chapter(s) must provide an electronic copy to the Western District Webmaster.
 - 7.3.7 In the event that the publishing chapter(s) become unable to fulfill the publication requirements, the Western District Council may vote to revoke the privilege of publishing *The Accent* from said chapter(s).

- 7.3.7.1 In the event that the publication rights have been revoked, publishing duties shall fall under the discretion of the Western District Council.

Discussion:

The 2011 Publications Committee discussed and reviewed the charges thoroughly. The committee evaluated the new "blog" style format for *The Accent*. It was determined that the new format is easy and convenient for members of the district to view and submit articles. The committee reviewed the number and quality of submissions and determined that prompts helped guide and encourage submissions. An incentive for a random drawing t-shirt to submission authors was also effective at bringing in more submissions. As a result, the committee encourages continuation and expansion of prompts and incentives. The committee also discussed how new articles are promoted and uploading stories in other formats.

The committee discussed the vision for *The Accent* and its purpose within the Western District. It was determined that the purpose of *The Accent* is to:

- Share experiences within the district
- Increase communication within the district
- Share ideas for fundraising and service projects
- Express feelings and thoughts within the district

Ideas were presented with the idea of increasing the quality of publications and lift responsibility from the council and the district webmaster. The primary idea discussed is to appoint one publisher from each organization (Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma) to be responsible for moderation, promotion, and publication of individual articles as well as a fall, winter, and spring publication. This publication would be compiled by the publishers as a review of the best articles since the prior publication. The publisher positions would be appointed by each respective district council in a process similar to that of the Western District Webmaster.

After discussing and refining the primary idea, the committee determined the appropriate constitutional changes required to implement this new vision. These amendments consisted of moving *The Accent* away from its current form as a chapter publication and creating bylaws to describe the "Best of" edition of *The Accent*.

Following the revamp of *The Accent*, the publications committee evaluated itself and reviewed its purposes. It was determined that the committee shall remain as a standing committee to evaluate the changes and implementation of changes made from prior years. In addition to the aforementioned responsibilities, the committee felt that it was appropriate and within the committee's jurisdiction to evaluate the district website and the Western District Listserv. In accordance with this determination, bylaw changes were proposed to include these new responsibilities. The committee also felt that it would be beneficial to request the presence of the webmaster and the publishers sitting on future Publications committee meetings and suggested proper bylaws changes as such.

Keeping in mind these alterations to the vision of publications for the Western District, the 2011 Publications Committee issued the following charges:

Charges:

The 2012 Joint Publications Committee

1. Submit all proposed changes to the Constitution to the Joint Jurisdiction Committee by the end of the first session.
2. Review the 2011 Publications Committee Report.
3. Evaluate *The Accent* publisher positions and their effectiveness at improving the quality of the publications.
4. Review all constitutional changes made at the 2011 Western District Convention.

The Western District Webmaster

1. Consider the idea of creating a user guide to the Western District Listserv. This guide would serve as a resource to making the Listserv more efficient and effective in communication.
2. Continue to innovate and try new things. The internet is constantly changing! By staying on top of the latest and greatest you can ensure that the district utilizes technology in the most effective means possible.

The Joint Western District Council

1. We charge the council with being more aware and having better and more effective electronic communication. The council should specifically focus on elimination of emails sent out that contain repetitive and/or duplicate information previously addressed.
2. Continue to publicize and encourage greater use of the Western District Website and the Western District Listserv.

The Western District

1. We charge chapter presidents and secretaries to continue taking a more active role in using and encouraging the use of available District resources.
2. We charge the Western District to keep the Western District Webmaster informed of chapter information and updates for the Western District Website.
3. We charge the general population of the Western District to submit quality articles to *The Accent* and regularly read submissions from other members.

Recommendations:

All recommendations made by the committee were charged to the appropriate person(s).

Acknowledgements:

We would like to thank those awesome people who volunteered to be a part of our open committee. Your ideas and input were extremely valuable and shaped the future of district publications and of the committee itself. A special thank you to our advisors Zac Humphrey and Annette Bowman. Your guidance and insight were critical in our success and efficiency as a committee. Thank you to our secretaries Rachael Vanderbeek and Meghan Payne for their awesome secretarial skills and one less worry for us. Thank you to the Western District Councils for giving us the opportunity to chair this committee and for having the confidence in our ability to succeed. Without the support and interest of the district, the publications committee would be null and void, and in that respect thank you to everyone for giving us a purpose.

As a side note of additional acknowledgement, as district webmaster (Jeffrey Brown), I would like to thank the entire district for their support, ideas, and overall enthusiasm regarding the website. I have thoroughly enjoyed being able to serve the district in this manner and am grateful for the opportunity. Being able to lead the publications committee was certainly an unexpected but beneficial supplement to the position!

Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Constitution
Revised: March 27th, 2011

I. General

- 1.1 The Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Constitution is to be used in conjunction with Section V of the National Constitution and the Western District Joint Constitution.
- 1.2 Kappa Kappa Psi recognizes Tau Beta Sigma as an equally associated organization with similar purpose, function, and role in the college and university band setting.
- 1.3 A District year is defined as the time between Western District Conventions.

II. Officers

- 2.1 In addition to the duties stated in the National Constitution, the duties of the Western District President shall be as follows:
 - 2.1.1 The President shall contact the presidents of all chapters in the District a minimum of two (2) times during the first six (6) months of office, and a minimum of two (2) times during the second six (6) months of office.
 - 2.1.2 The President shall notify the host chapter(s) of the guidelines for District Convention, as determined by the District Council. Said notification shall be made at least six (6) months prior to Convention.
- 2.2 In addition to the duties stated in the National Constitution, the duties of the Western District Vice President shall be as follows:
 - 2.2.1 The Vice President shall be responsible for communicating with the vice presidents of all chapters within the District, with regard to expansion and member retention, a minimum of two (2) times during the first six (6) months of office, and a minimum of two (2) times during the second six (6) months of office.
 - 2.2.2 The Vice President shall coordinate colonization activities.
 - 2.2.3 The Vice President shall also be responsible for coordinating educational content and updates made to the Western District Website.
- 2.3 In addition to the duties stated in the National Constitution, the duties of the Western District Secretary-Treasurer shall be as follows:
 - 2.3.1 The Secretary-Treasurer shall provide the Western District with a proposed budget for the upcoming District year at least two (2) weeks prior to convention.
 - 2.3.2 The Secretary-Treasurer shall maintain a ledger of the Western District's income and expenditures.
 - 2.3.3 The Secretary-Treasurer shall compile and publish a roster of names and contact information of all Western District Kappa Kappa Psi Officers by June 1 for Semester Schools and June 15 for Quarter Schools, and shall update said roster by October 15. Copies of said District roster shall be

provided to all District Officers, Governors, Chapters, and Colonies within the Western District.

2.3.4 The Secretary-Treasurer shall compile and publish a roster of names and contact information of all the Western District Membership by December 1, and shall update said list by March 1. Copies of said District roster shall be provided to all District Officers, Governors, Chapters, and Colonies within the Western District.

2.3.4.1 Chapters shall provide the Secretary-Treasurer with a roster of names and contact information of active chapter membership by November 15. Chapters shall be ineligible to apply for District awards until said roster is submitted.

2.3.5 The Secretary-Treasurer shall be responsible for the reproduction and distribution of the current Constitution from the Western District Convention.

2.3.6 The Secretary-Treasurer shall contact the Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of each chapter in the Western District a minimum of one (1) time during the first six (6) months of office, and a minimum of one (1) time during the second six (6) months of office.

2.4 In addition to the duties stated in the National Constitution, the duties of the Western District Member-at-Large shall be as follows:

2.4.1 The Member-at-Large shall assist the District Vice President with internal and external expansion, colonization, and the promotion of communication between all chapters and colonies of the District.

2.4.2 The Member-at-Large shall contact all chapters and colonies in the District a minimum of two (2) times during the first six (6) months of office, and a minimum of two (2) times during the second six (6) months of office. The Member-at-Large shall conduct an in-depth interview and offer feedback in order to assess the strengths, weaknesses, and needs of each chapter and colony.

2.4.3 All information collected by the Member-at-Large shall be drafted into a detailed report. Copies of said report shall be sent to each Western District Officer and Governor.

2.4.4 The Member-at-Large shall be responsible for assisting in the preparation of workshops for District Convention.

2.5 The Parliamentarian shall serve as a parliamentary procedure advisor to the District.

2.5.1 The Parliamentarian shall be appointed by the District Council after all the submitted applications have been reviewed by the District Council.

2.5.1.1 "The Parliamentarian shall be decided no later than three (3) weeks before the District Convention."

2.5.2 The Parliamentarian shall be an active member and shall not be a voting member of the District Council.

2.5.3 The Parliamentarian shall chair the Jurisdiction Committee.

2.5.3.1 The Parliamentarian shall provide a copy of the separate Western District Constitution to the members of the Jurisdiction Committee.

2.6 Candidates for District Office must submit the following:

- 2.6.1 A written application, stating office sought, as distributed by the Western District Council.
- 2.6.2 A brief written recommendation, signed by one chapter executive officer, stating the candidate's status within the chapter and expressing chapter support for the candidate.
- 2.6.3 A written recommendation from the Chapter Sponsor verifying the candidate's academic standing.
- 2.7 Each officer shall hold no more than two (2) consecutive District year terms in the same office.
- 2.8 A District Officer shall be removed from office if sufficient grounds exist to remove the Officer. The Officer's removal shall be requested by a chapter, District Officer, or District Governor, according to the following procedures:
 - 2.8.1 A formal complaint against the Officer in question must be sent to the District Governor(s). Said complaint must contain a complete list of charges and grievances against the Officer, with documentation.
 - 2.8.2 After receiving a formal complaint, the District Governor(s) shall mediate an impartial and balanced review of the charges and grievances against said Officer. Following the review, a two-thirds (2/3) vote from the remaining voting members of the District Council, as well as the approval of the District Governor(s), shall be necessary for the impeachment of the Officer. After such impeachment, the remaining District Council shall submit a detailed report of the allegations, evidence, analysis, and judgment to the active chapters of the District.
 - 2.8.3 Following the distribution of the impeachment report, active Chapters of the District shall have fourteen (14) days to submit a vote on the impeachment. A two-thirds (2/3) majority vote amongst those Chapters which submit their votes within the above timeframe shall be sufficient to remove the Officer from office.
 - 2.8.4 Upon removal, the Office in question shall be declared vacant, and regular procedures to fill a vacancy shall commence.
- 2.9 If a vacancy occurs in a District Office, the vacancy shall be filled according to the following procedures:
 - 2.9.1 In the event that a District Office is left vacant by election or vacated mid-term, all chapters, for a period of ten (10) days, may submit to the remaining District Council suggestions and candidates to fill the vacancy. Qualifications and requirements for candidacy shall be at the discretion of the Governor(s). The District Council shall notify all Chapters of the application process.
 - 2.9.1.1 If the office of District President is vacated mid-term, the District Vice President shall automatically succeed to the District Presidency until the next Western District Convention.
 - 2.9.2 If a vacancy occurs in any other District Office, the District President shall immediately notify all chapters of the vacancy. At that time, all chapters, for a period of ten (10) days, may submit to the remaining District Council suggestions and candidates to fill the vacancy. Qualifications and requirements for candidacy shall be at the discretion of the Governor(s). The District Council shall notify all Chapters of the application process.
 - 2.9.3 After the above stipulated ten (10) days, the District Council shall deliberate and then appoint a candidate to fill the vacant office.

- 2.9.4 The appointed candidate shall take office upon approval of the District Governor(s) and a simple majority of all active chapters in the District within fifteen (15) days of appointment.
 - 2.9.4.1 If an active chapter does not submit a vote within said fifteen (15) days, it will be assumed that said chapter abstains from the appointment process.

III. Nominations and Elections

- 3.1 Elections for the Western District President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Member-at-Large shall be held annually at the District Convention.
 - 3.1.1 A simple majority of votes cast shall be necessary for election.
 - 3.1.2 Options for voting in elections include any candidate for office and leaving the office vacant.
 - 3.1.3 If no candidate receives a simple majority vote, a run-off election shall commence between the two highest vote-getters.
 - 3.1.4 In the event of a tie after the second ballot, the office in question shall remain vacant, and the normal vacancy procedures shall commence after the conclusion of the Convention.
- 3.2 The procedure for selection of Honorary members of the Western District of Kappa Kappa Psi shall be as follows:
 - 3.2.1 Nominations from any member of the Western District of Kappa Kappa Psi shall be sent to the Western District President to be approved by a seventy-five (75) percent favorable vote of the Western District Council.
 - 3.2.2 Any financial obligations, if applicable, for the installation of an Honorary member shall be borne by the Western District of Kappa Kappa Psi.

IV. Finances

- 4.1 In the event that a chapter misses the deadline for an annual dues payment, they shall pay a fine to the Western District of Kappa Kappa Psi equal to the amount of money lost by the District in allotments that resulted from tardiness.
- 4.2 At the discretion of the District Governor(s), any chapter not fulfilling its financial obligations to the District shall be denied a delegate seat at the District Convention.
- 4.3 Before a District Officer can make a purchase for which they shall request a reimbursement from the district, they must get the approval of the District Governor(s) and the rest of the District Council. If prior approval is not granted, the officer shall be financially responsible for the purchase.

V. Meetings

- 5.1 A regularly called convention of the District shall be held every year. It is recommended that all National Officers, District Officers, and guests be recognized before seating of the delegates.

VI. Delegates and Proxies

- 6.1 If a chapter is not represented by a delegate or written proxy, then a proxy shall be assigned by the District President according to Greek alphabetical order. Alphabetical Order shall pick up from the last

proxy sat.

- 6.2 Each chapter shall be assessed a delegate fee which must be paid to the District Secretary-Treasurer for each District Convention. Failure to pay the delegate fee shall result in loss of a seat for the chapter's delegate, or the chapter's chosen proxy.
- 6.3 Chapters may seat proxy representatives in committees at the discretion of the chapter and Governor(s) based on the chapter proxy form.
 - c
 - 6.3.1 Said proxy must be an active, associate, or life member of the Fraternity.

VII. Committees

- 7.1 The following standing committees shall function at each District Convention: Jurisdiction Committee and Nominations Committee.
 - 7.1.1 The Jurisdiction Committee shall review all proposed changes to the Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Constitution, review the document for grammar and spelling mistakes, investigate opportunities to consolidate redundancies, and fix discrepancies and contradictions, paying close attention to constitutionality.
 - 7.1.2 The Nominations Committee shall recommend to the delegation a suitable candidate for each District Office in the form of a slate. In the event that the committee does not find any of the candidates suitable for a District Office, the slate for that office shall remain open.
- 7.2 Each chapter shall have a voting member on every standing committee, unless that chapter chooses not to do so.

VIII. Reports

- 8.1 Each District Officer and Chapter Delegate shall submit a report at District Convention. These reports shall be submitted in accordance with the host chapter's requirements for reproduction to the District Secretary-Treasurer, who shall be responsible for reproducing and forwarding copies as necessary. The District Secretary-Treasurer shall forward a copy to the District Governor(s), the National Executive Director, and also retain a copy for the convention minutes.
- 8.2 The host chapter shall submit a report on convention expenses for inclusion in the minutes.

IX. Awards

- 9.1 Ideal Active Achievement Award
 - 9.1.1 Three (3) members shall be awarded per District year.
 - 9.1.2 Submission deadlines shall be June 1, December 1, and March 1.
 - 9.1.3 The recipients of the award shall be recognized with a certificate and a Western District pin at the District Convention Banquet.
 - 9.1.4 The recipients shall be selected by the Western District Kappa Kappa Psi Council through nominations from the joint active membership of the Western District.
 - 9.1.5 Below are the criteria for nominating someone for the award:

- 9.1.5.1 The candidate shall be active in band.
- 9.1.5.2 The candidate shall have paid their Active dues on time.
- 9.1.5.3 District Officers are not eligible, though Chapter Officers are.
- 9.1.5.4 Each candidate shall win no more than once per District year.

X. Amendments

- 10.1 Any part of this Constitution may be amended at any time by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of all eligible voting chapters of the District.
 - 10.1.1 If the favorable vote on a proposed amendment is less than two-thirds (2/3), yet there is an absolute majority vote, the proposed amendment shall be tabled until the next regularly called Convention of the District.
 - 10.1.2 If two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast by the Convention are favorable, the proposed amendment shall be declared adopted. After such adoption, the amendment shall become operative and effective at the conclusion of the convention unless otherwise noted.

We continued our traditional projects and started new ones, all while working with the other Wagon chapters to put together this year's District Convention in Portland, Oregon. Here is an overview of what we've been up to.

This year the Gamma Chapter has continued to execute its standard repertoire of projects. This summer we hosted our third annual Washington Weekend. This event is similar to states days, but with more variable events and the freedom of summer weather. The turnout was great and included brothers from as far away as Arizona! Later in the summer we hosted barbeques for the summer concert band and for drum line camp to show our support for these groups. We helped out with marching band audition day, but due to a tight schedule, were not able to do our annual barbeque for rookies. Instead we served the entire band ice cream after rehearsal during pre-school drills. This year we had one visiting marching band at a football game so we were able to serve our trademark band treats to OSUMB. We took advantage of our own travel through candy and cookie grams sold for fifty cents each and delivered them on our full band away trips. Through the fall season we kept up our publications (the *Sundodger* for the band and *Gamma Gossip* for the fraternity community). For all of the band concerts we served concert snacks to the performers with a display board explaining who we are and what we do. We have also seen strength in our post-membership education lessons this year, and have one at most chapter meetings. Throughout the year we've had numerous social events either emphasizing spending time together or showcasing school of music performances. But all of these projects are just a day (or, year) in the life of Gamma.

In addition to our standard projects, we have sought out new opportunities to serve bands and improve our chapter. We expanded our standard band gear to include the immensely popular glass tumblers. In early fall we took a pep band around to local middle schools to show kids why they should join band. This had a great impact on the influx of students into the music programs at these schools. A few brothers helped alumnus Mr. Bowerly hold the first band competition at his school in Tenino, which was more exposure for continuing music into college. In the summer and fall we reached out to the district with a pen pal program to connect ourselves with brothers from around the district. Historically the Gamma Chapter has struggled to find essential services to provide for a band so well staffed and funded, but I think we have really struck gold in vastly expanding the Husky Band's recruiting efforts.

Gamma has done many projects this year, but our real headliner is our Alpha Gamma Class. This year we broke new ground in putting forth a true effort to recruit members of the concert bands. We also attracted members of sections we usually have trouble with, which will lay the ground work for a better rapport with these sections, and hopefully more brothers from them. A grand total of nineteen new brothers went through as the Alpha Gamma Class, nearly doubling the size of Gamma. I look forward to seeing where their new ideas will take

- Annual Thanksgiving dinner for band members
- Assisting with the Boise Jazz Society set-up and tear down
- Teddy bear drive – new stuffed animals donated to the St. Luke’s Children’s hospital, and used stuffed animals donated to a home for victims of domestic abuse.
- Instrument Bath Day for the marching band
- Marching for ALS – we marched to help bring awareness and raise funds for ALS, more commonly known as Lou Gehrig’s Disease.
- Mr. and Miss Blue Thunder Pageant at the band banquet
- Recital receptions for Taggart Lewis, Aaron Messinger, and Dave & Maggie Simon
- Annual assistance with the Music Department Holiday Concert – setting up, changing sets, and tearing down for this concert
- Winter Planning Retreat at a member’s house for a day to plan out spring and watch movies with our Brothers!
- Assisting with the Boise State Band Clinic for 7 high schools, guiding bands, announcing, set-up and teardown as necessary, and guarding storage rooms.
- Super Secret Narwhal Cupid Super Bowl Party at a Brother’s house
- Establishing a NIB ad-hoc committee to help increase knowledge and participation in the NIB this year.
- Baja Fresh Profit Share

Brothers and Sisters of the Western District,

This past year has been filled with many great accomplishments for Iota Pi. These have helped our chapter grow as a whole and have also strengthened the bonds of individual brothers. We have successfully transitioned to a new sponsor of our chapter, as well as a new Director of Bands at our university. We have continued to serve our bands on a large scale through fundraising, service projects, developing music in younger musicians and creating fun social experiences for band members at Cal Poly. We have also recently seen the addition of 22 new brothers into our chapter, as we welcomed the energetic and passionate Chi class into our brotherhood. About a month ago, we also received the wonderful news that our chapter was once again distinguished with the Kappa Kappa Psi Chapter Leadership Award and in the running for the William Scroggs Founders Trophy. However, like any year, we have seen our share of ups and downs. Throughout the year, we have set a goal to improve communication as brothers and have a better understanding for different communication types. This allows us to provide and receive constructive criticism in order to keep our chapter always striving for greater accomplishments and to not become complacent with what we have always done. Provided in this report is a more detailed summary of the achievements and events of Iota Pi over the past year.

New Beginnings:

- In June of 2010 the Cal Poly Director of Bands, William Johnson, retired after dedicating 44 years to the Cal Poly music programs. He served the bands in every way possible and was the only sponsor that Iota Pi had ever known since it was founded in 1992. This led to a very uncertain transition period for our bands and our chapter, but also a great opportunity for growth through change. We welcomed Dr. Andrew McMahan to Cal Poly at the beginning of the 2010-2011 school year and he has already accomplished amazing things musically with our ensembles. From the beginning he showed a great love and support for Kappa Kappa Psi, as well as showing recognition for everything that our chapter accomplished. At the end of fall quarter, Dr. McMahan was recognized for his support and became an honorary brother of our great fraternity. He has continued to advise and support our chapter with everything that we do, alongside our new chapter sponsor and Associate Director of Bands, Christopher Woodruff. Working together with both of these supportive and caring advisors has allowed for our chapter to continue flourishing through this transition time.
- Iota Pi recognized two of our amazing and supportive band alumni with honorary membership. John and Kathy Lowe continually support the Cal Poly marching band through offering scholarships, providing dinner to the whole tournament band at Big West and coming to as many games as possible when instrumentation is needed for our pep bands.
- On March 6, 2011 Iota Pi welcomed 22 new active brothers into our chapter with the initiation of the Chi class. All of these new brothers have shown their passion for the bands and a willingness to bring forward new perspectives to the chapter. They understand the commitment of actively serving the bands and we are very excited to continue watching them grow and contribute to our brotherhood.

Service Projects:

- Iota Pi has continued to serve the bands at Cal Poly, always trying to find new ways to get people excited about service. This year, the service committee put on the first Epic Day of Service. This was a project-based day that included cleaning, organizing, and building. Although there were a few glitches with logistics, the day proved to be very successful and accomplished many great things.
- Iota Pi continues to play a large part in serving the music department through assisting with concerts. The music department often relies on us for selling tickets or merchandise, completing stage set-ups and logistics, and supporting all of the ensembles through attendance and support at the events. We try to provide a reception after each of the concerts, complete with homemade treats and a chocolate fountain. We also help haul equipment and do set-ups for jazz band gigs that are at off-campus locations.
- The Chi class took on the large task of organizing all of the brass ensemble music that has been accumulating over the years. They cataloged all of this and made it much more accessible for the ensembles to utilize.

- As a way to show our appreciation to visiting bands, we always make goodie bags for these groups. We also provide goodie bags and treats for our band as we travel for football games and basketball tournaments.
- Providing a safe and fun social experience for band members is very important for our chapter. Our band social committee has put on some of the annual events such as Capture the Flag, Sardines, Movie Night, Wii Tournament Night, Lyndsey's B.Y.O.Banana, hiking trips and Musician's Ball. We have also added new events such as the Pet Rock Party (with hot cocoa) that could go in between our orchestra rehearsals to encourage involvement from more than just the marching bands.

Promoting Music:

- In order to support music in our community, Iota Pi hosts musical petting zoos at various different venues. Some of these have been at schools, while others occur at fairs or at the local farmer's market. These provide opportunities for kids (and their parents) to try out different instruments and see what it is like to create music.
- We assist some of the local high schools with instrumentation at their football games. This allows them to have a full band, but also helps us promote Cal Poly music and more generally maintaining music through college, good sportsmanship and good musicianship.
- One of the founding brothers of Iota Pi teaches middle school and high school music in Gonzales. We provide a "band camp" clinic for his students where we send up musicians who work individually with the students who play their instrument. This is an amazing opportunity for us to discover what it is like to teach our instrument and also a chance for the students to get more individual attention with their playing. This year we also had several music majors participate in this clinic who are not brothers of Kappa Kappa Psi.
- Our annual All-State Festival went very smoothly last year and we saw one of the best groups of students we had ever had before. These students were given the opportunity to play under great conductors, such as J. Eric Schmidt, and to get an opportunity to experience Cal Poly and our music programs offered here. We are currently working through all of the planning and details for this upcoming festival in April.

Fundraising with a Purpose:

- Last year we did a lot of fundraising that went specifically to our Wind Ensemble's Walt Disney Hall tour. This year we are trying to match those fundraising efforts as our Jazz Bands plan to go on a tour to Puerto Rico. These efforts include making a base donation, as well as donating the profits from some of our larger fundraisers, such as an Applebee's breakfast fundraiser.
- We continued to provide profit shares at some of the band favorites, such as Panda Express, Powell's Candy and Jamba Juice. We are also in contact with some of the local businesses to try to start similar profit shares with them.
- There was a very epic penny wars between the sections of the marching band that resulted in the trumpets coming out in first place. We encouraged alumni to contribute when they were here for homecoming and also saw some contributions from students in other ensembles.
- This year we decided to once again sell band calendars, using professional pictures taken by numerous parents of band members. These always sell well and make great Christmas gifts. We sold "Mustang Band" sweatpants and now our Chi class is selling Poly Music Sweatshirts- hoping to target different ensembles as well.
- Next month we will be attempting a brand new fundraiser that is put on by one of the local car washes and has proven to be rather successful for other groups. We essentially are there all day holding up signs and trying to get people to go in, and a percentage of the profit from the day goes to our organization.

Brotherhood:

- This is one of the largest areas that we are working to change and move forward to develop closer bonds and a better understanding of all of our brothers. We want to have all of our brothers always interact in a respectful and constructive way, and feel confident with voicing their thoughts and ideas. We are working to achieve this through chapter retreats, brotherhood dinners and discussions. This will continue be a large focus point for our chapter throughout next quarter, especially with our large new class and large graduating class in June.

Overall, it has been an amazing year and we continuously work toward improvement as a chapter. We are very excited for the ideas and contributions of the Chi class to our chapter and hope to really feed off of their enthusiasm and commitment to help our chapter grow together. Over the next year we will see a large change in our membership, with about half of our current chapter graduating and these younger members really stepping up. It should be a very exciting time for our chapter and hopefully we will get to really see our chapter continue to grow and develop while doing what we love most- serving the bands!

2011 Kappa Kappa Psi Jurisdiction Committee Report

Committee: Jurisdiction Committee
Chair: Jason Scapa, Western District Parliamentarian, Psi Chapter, KKΨ
Advisor: Adam Bates, KKΨ

The Jurisdiction Committee Shall:

7. Review the 2010 Jurisdiction Committee Report.
8. Sweep Bylaws for grammar and spelling errors.
9. Prepare any Proposed Changes for the Delegates.

Jurisdiction Committee is Charged to:

The 2010 Jurisdiction Committee charges the 2012 Jurisdiction Committee the following:

1. Please evaluate all the new and amended policies that go into effect as a result of the vote from the 2010 convention. This includes the newly proposed Article III Nominations and Elections, the amended method to fill a vacancy, and the amended method to remove an officer.

The 2010 Jurisdiction Committee Charges the District Council and Governors to the following:

1. Please have a Parliamentarian and a KKPsi Jurisdiction Committee appointed ONE MONTH before the beginning of the Western District Convention, 2011. This will make the job a lot easier for the Parliamentarian, and it will enable the Jurisdiction Committee to come into Convention with a lot more expertise.

According to the Joint Western District Constitutions:

- 7.1.1 The Jurisdiction Committee shall review all proposed changes to the Kappa Kappa Psi Western District Constitution, review the document for grammar and spelling mistakes, investigate opportunities to consolidate redundancies, and fix discrepancies and contradictions, paying close attention to constitutionality.

Discussion:

This year's jurisdiction committee met to discuss and evaluate the proposed amendments from the 2010 WD Convention. The Committee focused its attention with regards to vacancies and how these arise as either a result of choice in election or by an officer stepping down or being removed from office. We sought to clarify the constitutional ability to vote "no candidate" as an option in voting. This has a major effect on the clause that stipulates that the VP can assume the President's Office in the event of a vacancy, stating that this can only occur through a vacated office and not a vacant office. After this, the Committee sought to codify the Charge concerning the selection of Parliamentarian in advance. Lastly, the committee recommended several grammar changes to clear up convoluted and complex syntax.

Charges:

The 2011 Jurisdiction Committee charges the 2012 Jurisdiction Committee with the following:

3. Evaluate the capitalization of "Office"/"Officer" throughout Constitution (i.e. 2.8, 2.8.4 compared to 3.1.3) to determine if specific designation is necessary.
4. Comb through the Constitution for phrases that can be made more clear and concise.

The 2011 Jurisdiction Committee charges the 2011 and 2012 Secretary-Treasurer the following:

1. Ensure that the Constitution has the CORRECT DATE at the top to reflect the recent revisions. This will avoid confusion over the current edition of the Constitution.

2011 Western District Convention Minutes

Recommendations:

The 2011 Jurisdiction Committee recommends that:

12. Add new Article 2.5.1.1 to read: "The Parliamentarian shall be decided no later than three (3) weeks before the District Convention."
13. Add new Article 3.1.2 to read: "Options for voting in elections include any candidate for office and leaving the office vacant."
14. Article 2.9 should be amended to read the following:
 - 2.9 If a vacancy occurs in a District Office, the vacancy shall be filled according to the following procedures:
 - 2.9.1 In the event that a District Office is left vacant by election or vacated mid-term, all chapters, for a period of ten (10) days, may submit to the remaining District Council suggestions and candidates to fill the vacancy. Qualifications and requirements for candidacy shall be at the discretion of the Governor(s). The District Council shall notify all Chapters of the application process.
 - 2.9.1.1 If the office of District President is vacated mid-term, the District Vice President shall automatically succeed to the District Presidency until the next Western District Convention.
 - 2.9.2 If a vacancy occurs in any other District Office, the District President shall immediately notify all chapters of the vacancy. At that time, all chapters, for a period of ten (10) days, may submit to the remaining District Council suggestions and candidates to fill the vacancy. Qualifications and requirements for candidacy shall be at the discretion of the Governor(s). The District Council shall notify all Chapters of the application process.
 - 2.9.3 After the above stipulated ten (10) days, the District Council shall deliberate and then appoint a candidate to fill the vacant office.
 - 2.9.4 The appointed candidate shall take office upon approval of the District Governor(s) and a simple majority of all active chapters in the District within fifteen (15) days of appointment.
 - 2.9.4.1 If an active chapter does not submit a vote within said fifteen (15) days, it will be assumed that said chapter abstains from the appointment process.
15. Add new Article 6.3 to read: "Chapters may seat proxy representatives in committees at the discretion of the chapter and Governor(s) based on the chapter proxy form."
16. Add new Article 6.3.1 to read: "Said proxy must be an active, associate, life member, or member of the Alumni Association of the Fraternity."
17. Article 10.1.2 be amended to read: "If two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast by the Convention are favorable, the proposed amendment shall be declared adopted. After such adoption, the amendment shall become operative and effective at the conclusion of the convention unless otherwise noted."
18. Article 2.8.2 be amended to read: "After receiving a formal complaint, the District Governor(s) shall mediate an impartial and balanced review of the charges and grievances against said Officer. Following the review, a two-thirds (2/3) vote from the remaining voting members of the District Council, as well as the approval of the District Governor(s), shall be necessary for the impeachment of the Officer. After such impeachment, the remaining District Council shall submit a detailed report of the allegations, evidence, analysis, and judgment to the active chapters of the District."
19. Article 4.1 be amended to read, "In the event that a chapter misses the deadline for an annual dues payment, they shall pay a fine to the Western District of Kappa Kappa Psi equal to the amount of money lost by the District in allotments that resulted from tardiness."
20. Articles 1.3, 2.1.1, 2.2.1, 2.3.1, 2.3.4.1, 2.5, 2.7, 4.3, 9.1.1, and 9.1.5.4 should be amended to capitalize "District".
21. Articles 10.1 and 10.1.1 be amended to say "two-thirds" (hyphenated).
22. Renumber remaining constitutional amendments accordingly to reflect new additions and subtractions.

Tau Beta Sigma Western District Constitution

Revised: March 27th, 2011

Article I – General

- 1.01 This document establishes the authorized regulations pertaining to the functions and operations of the Western District and is intended for use in conjunction with the National Constitution of Tau Beta Sigma and the Western District Joint Constitution.
- 1.02 This document shall not take precedence over the National Constitution of Tau Beta Sigma.
- 1.03 Tau Beta Sigma recognizes Kappa Kappa Psi as an equal associated organization with a similar purpose, function, and role in the college and university band setting.

Article II – Officers

- 2.01 Candidates for elected District Office shall:
 - 2.01.01 Be an active or associate member in good standing of the Sorority.
 - 2.01.02 Complete an interview with the Nominations Committee.
 - 2.01.03 Submit a cover letter and resume including personal information and goals for the office.
 - 2.01.04 Submit a letter of recommendation from their Chapter.
 - 2.01.05 Submit a letter of recommendation from their Chapter Sponsor.
 - 2.01.06 Candidates for the Western District President shall be an active member for at least one (1) calendar year.
- 2.02 Each District Officer shall hold no more than two (2) consecutive single-year terms in the same office.
- 2.03 The Tau Beta Sigma Western District Council shall consist of President, Vice President of Membership, Vice President of Special Projects, and Secretary-Treasurer. Officer duties are outlined in the National Constitution.
- 2.04 In addition, President shall:
 - 2.04.01 Communicate to the Chapters on matters pertaining to District business and National affairs.
- 2.05 In addition, the Vice President of Membership shall:
 - 2.05.01 Be responsible for regular communication and correspondence with the appropriate chapter officers regarding membership retention, membership education, and expansion.
- 2.06 In addition, the Vice President of Special Projects shall:
 - 2.06.01 Be responsible for creating and developing projects to benefit the District, as directed by the District Council and Counselor.

- 2.06.02 Compile events, names, dates and activities of importance to the district and update the District History each year. The District History shall be published to the district prior to District Convention via the Western District website and announced via the Western District listserv.
- 2.07 In addition, the Secretary-Treasurer shall:
- 2.07.01 Record, publish, and distribute the minutes of all meetings of the District to the District Council, the District Counselor, and the National President.
- 2.07.02 Control the receipt and disbursement of all monies of the District.
- 2.07.03 Compile and distribute a District Directory twice per year.
- 2.07.04 Submit a detailed ledger to be included in the above minutes of all of the district expenses during their term by the beginning of the opening joint session at the District Convention.
- 2.07.05 Submit a proposed budget to be included in the above minutes for the following term that is based on the above ledger to the district by the beginning of the opening joint session at the District Convention.
- 2.07.06 Maintain an updated copy of the budget to be presented if requested by the District Council or chapter members.
- 2.08 In the event that the office of President is vacated, the District Vice President of Membership shall become the District President.
- 2.09 Vacant offices shall be appointed by the District Council, with the approval of the Counselor, through an application and interview process. Appointments must happen within thirty calendar days of the vacancy of the office and must be confirmed by a simple majority of the active chapters.
- 2.10 An unopposed candidate at District Convention may not be eligible for appointment by the District council for the same office if vacant unless no other eligible applicants apply.
- 2.11 Any District Officer may be removed from office if it is determined unanimously by the remaining district Officers and the District Counselor that a District Officer has failed to uphold the duties of her/his office as set forth in the Constitution.
- 2.11.01 Notice of such vacancy shall be sent to each chapter by the District Counselor so that chapters may comment and submit suggestions and candidates.
- 2.11.02 The District Counselor shall appoint a replacement that must be confirmed by a simple majority of the active chapters within thirty days of appointment.
- 2.12 A chapter may voice complaint(s) regarding the ability of a District Officer to uphold the duties of her/his office, as set forth in the Constitution, in the following way:
- 2.12.01 The chapter(s) involved shall voice their complaint(s) to the District President and the District Counselor. If the officer in question is the District President, then the chapter(s) involved shall contact the District Counselor and the Vice President of Membership.
- 2.12.02 The District President and the District Counselor have up to a fortnight (2 weeks) in which to contact the officer in question and contact the chapter(s) involved. If the officer in question is the District President, then the District Counselor and the Vice President of Membership have up to a fortnight (2 weeks) to follow the above procedures.

2.12.03 If deemed necessary by the District President and District Counselor, the procedures described in 2.11 shall be followed. If the officer in question is the District President, the District Counselor and the Vice President of Membership, if they deem necessary, shall follow the procedures described in 2.11.

2.13 The Parliamentarian shall:

2.13.01 Serve as a parliamentary procedure advisor to the district.

2.13.02 Be appointed by the District Council for a term designated by the District Council, or as deemed necessary by the District Counselor, by an application and selection process.

2.13.03 Be an active member in the sorority and shall not be a voting member of the District Council.

2.13.04 Chair the Jurisdiction Committee.

2.13.05 Ensure that updated copies of the Constitution are distributed to the District Council immediately following District Convention.

2.13.06 Provide a copy of the Constitution to the separate Jurisdiction Committee.

Article III - Committees

3.01 The standing committees of the Tau Beta Sigma Western District shall be: Nominations, Membership, Programs, Jurisdiction, and Convention Site.

3.01.01 The following committees shall meet jointly with their Kappa Kappa Psi counterparts: Programs, Jurisdiction, Publications, and Convention Site.

3.01.02 The special committees of Tau Beta Sigma Western District shall be: Ways and Means.

3.02 The Nominations Committee shall:

3.02.01 Investigate the eligibility of and interview candidates for District Office according to the requirements set forth by the National and District Constitutions.

3.02.02 Slate up to one (1) member for each office and shall present those names to the Convention the night prior to closing session.

3.02.03 Have the authority to waive any requirement stated in 2.01 except 2.01.01, 2.01.02, and 2.01.06 for a candidate running off the floor provided the requirements are fulfilled within thirty days of election, if elected. Failure to meet the requirements results in a vacant office to be filled per 2.09.

3.03 The Membership Committee shall:

3.03.01 Discuss new ideas and potential resources to be used for membership retention, education, involvement, and recruitment.

3.04 The Programs Committee shall:

3.04.01 Meet separately to decide the winner of the Tau Beta Sigma Tiger Award and the Outstanding Graduating Senior Award.

3.05 The Jurisdiction Committee shall:

3.05.01 Examine, recommend, and submit to the Convention all propositions, revisions, and alterations as amendments to the District Constitution

3.06 The Ways and Means Committee shall be formed on an as-needed basis determined by the Western District President under the advisement of the Western District Secretary/Treasurer for the purpose of handling discrepancies or financing special projects.

Article IV – Delegates and Proxies

4.01 The active members of the Chapter shall elect its delegates at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Chapter.

4.02 Chapters unable to attend convention may designate another chapter as their proxy delegate.

4.03 All seats of chapters in good standing that are vacant after the seating of delegates and designated proxies shall be filled alphabetically with Proxies from the chapters present. This shall be done according to the alphabetical listing of the chapters in the District, beginning with the next chapter after the last one seated at the prior Convention.

Article V – Nominations and Elections

5.01 Elections shall be held annually at the District Convention.

5.02 Each name slated by the Nominations Committee shall be considered nominated.

5.03 After the slate has been read, nominations from the floor shall be accepted.

5.03.01 After being nominated, a potential candidate may either accept or decline the nomination.

5.03.02 Nominees from the floor must meet the requirements for running for District Office in Section 2.01, unless waived by the Nominations Committee as described in 3.02.03.

5.04 Upon closure of nominations, candidates shall be asked to leave the session and shall individually be brought back to give a speech and participate in a question and answer session.

5.05 A majority of all votes shall be necessary for election.

5.05.01 If no candidate receives a simple majority vote, a run-off election shall commence between the two candidates with the most votes.

5.05.02 In the event that a tie cannot be broken, the office shall remain vacant.

5.06 The procedure for selection of Honorary members of the Western District of Tau Beta Sigma shall be as follows:

5.06.01 Nominations from any member of the Western District shall be sent to the Western District President to be unanimously approved by the Western District Council.

Article VI – Awards

6.01 The Distinguished Sister Award:

6.01.01 This award shall be presented in recognition of strong Active or Associate members of the Western District who exemplify our Purposes, Five Qualities, and Eight Essential Factors through their attitude, involvement, participation, leadership, and inspiration. This shall be displayed through Tau Beta Sigma and their respective band programs. Three (3) winners shall be decided by the Western District Council annually by October 15, January 15, and March 15.

6.02 The Tau Beta Sigma Tiger Award:

6.02.01 This award may be presented in recognition of the chapter that exudes the most spirit and participation at Western District events. The winner shall be decided by the Programs Committee.

6.03 The Outstanding Graduating Senior Award:

6.03.01 This award may be presented to a graduating member of Tau Beta Sigma in recognition of their dedication to the Ideals of the Sorority, academic achievement, and leaving a lasting impact on their chapter. The winner shall be decided by the Programs Committee.

6.04 The Kris Wright Award:

6.04.01 This award may be presented to one member of Tau Beta Sigma who has demonstrated outstanding and continued service to the Sorority's Western District. Nominees must be life, honorary, or alumni members of Tau Beta Sigma. Recipients shall be selected by the Western District Council, and applications will be due by March 1st. Nominees must have attained an accumulation of Life, Honorary, or Alumni Status of five (5) years after completing their education or terminating their affiliation with their college or university.

Article VII – Amendments

7.01 Individuals or committees may submit proposed amendments to the Jurisdiction Committee to be considered for inclusion in the District Constitution.

7.02 Any part of this Constitution may be amended at any time by a simple majority of all eligible voting chapters of the district.

The Tau Beta Sigma Jurisdiction Committee Shall:

- Review the 2010 Tau Beta Sigma Separate Jurisdiction Committee Report.
- Review the entire document for redundancy, spelling, grammar, and style.
- Continue to work with Kappa Kappa Psi Jurisdiction Committee to factor out similar clauses in the Joint Constitution.
- Examine all suggested changes to the separate Constitution in terms of language and constitutionality.
- Funnel all suggested changes to the separate Constitution through any committees it may affect.
- Review all charges in the supplementary charges document prepared by the TBS Western District Council.

The 2011 Tau Beta Sigma Jurisdiction Committee is Charged to:

- Have fun because jurisdiction IS fun!
 - Finish all separate bylaw matters in less than our, record-setting time of 39 minutes.
 - Bring up the placement of zeros in the bylaws multiple times, in keeping with tradition.
1. Continue to gather repeatedly outside of scheduled meeting times to discuss more jurisdiction – because it's that fun - and to maintain Jurisdiction Hype through hi-fives, cheers, and hug circles.
 2. Come up with at least one (1) new ridiculous charge for the 2011 Jurisdiction Committee.

According to the Tau Beta Sigma Western District Constitution:

1. The Jurisdiction Committee shall:
2. Examine, recommend, and submit to the Convention all propositions, revisions, and alterations as amendment to the District Constitution

Discussion:

Discussion in the 2011 Tau Beta Sigma Jurisdiction Committee covered recommendations from Tau Beta Sigma District officers, Nominations Committee and suggestions from Jurisdiction Committee members. There were very few points of contention as nearly all of our recommendations simply clarify or clean up errors in existing policy. Several points that were unclear in the current constitution have been charged to appropriate persons.

The 2011 Jurisdiction Committee broke tradition by not discussing the placement of zeros in the formatting of the District Constitution, nor was the Committee required to meet outside of scheduled meeting times. However, the Committee very consciously continued the tradition Jurisdiction Hug Circles.

Charges from the 2011 Tau Beta Sigma Jurisdiction Committee:

To the 2011-2012 Tau Beta Sigma District Officers-

2. Re-instate the Membership Committee at the 2012 Western District Convention.
3. Although this committee has been inactive for four years, Membership is a standing committee prescribed by the National Constitution and, as such, cannot be eliminated. We suggest the involvement of the Western District Vice President of Membership in the Membership Committee.

To the 2012 Tau Beta Sigma Parliamentarian-

4. Provide physical copies of all amendments brought before the jurisdiction committee to all committee members.
5. Provide physical copies of all committee recommendations to convention delegates.
6. Create a slide show presentation of all committee recommendations so that they may be observed by all members in attendance.
7. You will likely write your committee report at 2:00 am, make sure you have some one proof read the report before you sent it off.
8. Have fun chairing the jurisdiction committee- if you have a good time (or at least act like you are) your committee members will have a good time too.

To the 2012 Tau Beta Sigma Jurisdiction Committee-

9. Define the terms *calendar year*, *district year* and a *cademic year* and consider the application of these terms throughout the Tau Beta Sigma District Constitution.
10. Consider punctuation in the sub-articles of 2.01. The current use of periods is grammatically inappropriate; in this case commas or semicolons would be more correct.
11. Keep in mind the size of the Tau Beta Sigma Jurisdiction Committee, zealous use of parliamentary procedure will likely hinder your productivity. Consider the application of informal parliamentary procedure, "Bob's Rules."
12. Maintain jurisdiction traditions of having a good time in committee sessions and hug circles.
13. In the absence of a volunteer for committee secretary, elect the committee secretary by use of "nose goes" or similar procedure.

To the 2012 Tau Beta Sigma Programs Committee-

14. Clarify who is eligible for the Outstanding Graduating Senior Award outlined in 6.03. Specifically, when does a sister have to graduate by to be eligible?

Recommendations to the 2011 Tau Beta Sigma Western District Convention:

Recognizing the final sentence of 6.04.01 was created to make it possible to give the Kris Wright award to Kris Wright at last year's Convention and it is now obsolete, we recommend:

Striking-out the final sentence of 6.04.01, "The inaugural award shall be presented to Kris Wright at the 2010 Western District Convention." The amended article will read:

6.04.01 This award may be presented to one member of Tau Beta Sigma who has demonstrated outstanding and continued service to the Sorority's Western District. Nominees must be life, honorary, or alumni members of Tau Beta Sigma. Recipients shall be selected by the Western District Council, and applications will be due by March 1st. Nominees must have attained an accumulation of Life, Honorary, or Alumni Status of five (5) years after completing their education or terminating their affiliation with their college or university.

Acknowledging the rights of associate members. We recommend:

Adding "or associate" after "active" in 2.01.01. The amended article will read:

2.01.01 Be an active or associate member in good standing of the Sorority.

Desiring clarity, we recommend:

Adding "(2 weeks)" after "fortnight" both times it appears in 2.12.02. The amended article will read:

2.12.02 The District President and the District Counselor have up to a fortnight (2 weeks) in which to contact the officer in question and contact the chapter(s) involved. If the officer in question is the District President, then the District Counselor and the Vice President of Membership have up to a fortnight (2 weeks) to follow the above procedures.

Observing an error referencing an article that does not exist, we recommend:

Replacing "3.02.04" with "3.02.03" in 5.03.02. The amended article will read:

5.03.02 Nominees from the floor must meet the requirements for running for District Office in Section 2.01, unless waived by the Nominations Committee as described in 3.02.03

We also decided to release the slate on Saturday night, after the conclusion of Banquet and the Talent Show. Additionally, we set up interview times for each of the candidates.

Saturday morning met and carried out the interviews with each candidate. Each candidate was given a thirty minute time slot. After completion of the interviews, we discussed and nominated candidates for each office. A list of the questions asked of the candidates is included in the end of the official report, minor alterations to the previously provided list of questions were made.

Charges:**The Tau Beta Sigma Nominations Committee is Charged to:**

1. Verify the accuracy of the requirements listed in the officer candidate checklist.
2. Submit any proposed changes to the Constitution to the Jurisdiction Committee by the end of the first session.
3. Decide during the first session when the slate will be released.
4. Schedule meeting times to interview each candidate.
5. Assist with the candidate presentation on Friday evening.
